#### **ABOUT THE PERFORMERS**

James Sherepa is a singing actor from Fort Wayne, Indiana. He is a graduate of Baldwin Wallace Conservatory of Music, and the University of Illinois (Urbana-Champaign), where he earned his Bachelor and Master's degrees respectively. Upon moving to Anoka, MN he joins The Gregorian Singers as well as the St. Paul's Episcopal Church Choir, as a section leader. As an instructor, he has worked with the St. Paul Conservatory of Music, Northern Starz Center for the Performing Arts, and Lyric Arts Theatre in Anoka. Additionally, he is the general music teacher at Montessori Renaissance Academy in Anoka, teaching students in grades 1through 8.. James' vocal background consists mainly of opera and classical art song. He has performed with Sugar Creek Opera (Watseka), Southern Illinois Music Festival (Carbondale), MIOpera (Bloomington-Normal), Cleveland Opera Theater (Cleveland), and The Station Theater (Urbana) among others. Some of James' favorite performances include; Farinelli and the King (Farinelli), Hansel and Gretel (Witch), and Die Entführung aus dem Serail (Pedrillo). Beyond the stage, James has a passion for private vocal instruction, and has been teaching for over a decade. He brings a strong understanding of vocal technique that allows him to teach classical repertoire as well as contemporary musical theatre, jazz, and pop music. James embraces the responsibility of encouraging young singers to find their voice and share that gift.

Milena Petkovic was born in Prizren, Serbia. She began playing classical guitar at the age of eleven. She finished High Music School in Belgrade with three diplomas: Music Theory, Lute and Classical Guitar. In 2011 Milena graduated from the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad with a Bachelor of Music Degree in Guitar Performance under the guidance of Prof. Zoran Krajišnik. During her studies she participated in numerous national and international music festivals and competitions. Her awards include: second prize for guitar performance at the International Guitar Festival, Kyustendil, Bulgaria (2006), first prize at Guitar Open Festival in Subotica, Serbia (2010), and second prize at Naissus Guitar Festival in Niš, Serbia (2010). She continued her studies at Indiana University, graduating in 2014 with a Performer Diploma and Master's Degree in Guitar Performance from the Jacobs School of Music, under the guidance of Maestro Ernesto Bitetti. She received her DMA from the University of Minnesota in 2021. Milena often performs as a soloist and in various chamber ensembles - guitar duo, duo with flute, violin and clarinet. Since 2021 she has been a member of the Minneapolis Guitar Quartet. Milena has performed across the United States as well as in Serbia, Montenegro, Bulgaria, Hungary and Italy. Her teaching experience includes teaching beginner and advanced guitar classes and individual lessons for six years as a Teaching Assistant at Indiana University and University of Minnesota. She was also a Pre-College guitar instructor at the Jacobs School of Music for two years. Since 2018 Milena has worked with the Minnesota Guitar Society in their Guitar in Our Schools program as a project coordinator. She joined the faculty of the Saint Paul Conservatory of Music in 2017.
